From The Superintendent

I continue to be humbled by the responsibilities you entrust me with as I serve as your Superintendent of Schools. Having just completed my third year of service, I am proud of the direction our schools are taking. I am proud and thankful for your vision and support through the passing of the school improvement referendum.

Because of your continued support, we have been able to maintain thriving art and music programs. We have experienced outstanding performances by our artists and musicians, and our programs continue to achieve new levels of participation and success including; the addition of a spring concert by the lake by our middle school and high school bands, outstanding recognition of our band and choral students at ISSMA competition, a very successful performance by our choral students in the Spring Spectacular, and continuing musical and drama productions by Hanover thespians.

Because of your continued support, we have been able to add teaching staff at the elementary level to keep class sizes down, particularly in grades K-2, where we teach the most critical of all skills, reading. Providing personal attention to our elementary students continues to be enhanced by our ability to retain our classroom instructional aides. In addition, Makerspace areas are being added to our media centers to introduce and develop problem solving skills to our students.

Because of your continued support, we have been able to add a pre-engineering curriculum, at our middle school. This curriculum, Project Lead The Way (PLTW), was developed to give students a basic introduction to problem-solving through the use of science, math and technology. In addition, we have begun looking at adding an additional sixth grade band class.

Because of your continued support, we have been able to increase our PLTW offerings at Hanover Central High School: AP Computer Science Principles and Civil Engineering; both courses will count as a career and technical education course. We have expanded our course offerings in business to include dual credit courses with Ivy Tech. Many of these courses may result in industry certification, college credits, or both. We have also added a second guidance counselor to our professional staff to better serve our freshman and sophomore student body.

This is an exciting time to be a part of the Hanover family. This year we will begin planning for increasing the use of technology in our classrooms. The School Board and I will also be hosting four public input sessions again this year. The first of these sessions will be in September and I encourage you to attend and participate. I will continue to serve with “an attitude of gratitude” and I thank you for your support.

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What is Curriculum Mapping?

Five and Forward

Parents are our children's first and most important teachers. Second to parents, are the educators that spend a large part of the day with children entrusted to them.

Parents meet the first day of kindergarten with joy, apprehension and the overwhelming desire to know that their children will be safe, loved, and learn all that's necessary to prepare them for the world outside of school. Students step on the bus for the first time and parents feel pangs of worry, wanting the very best for their sons and daughters. They share their children with us, hoping that we will care for them in their absence. Hence, the term in loco parentis – in place of a parent, an obligation we do not take lightly.

Preparing kids with academic and social tools is a profound responsibility, as well as a wonderful opportunity. This preparation underscores the importance of a sound and aligned curriculum that is guaranteed and viable. Our goal is to guarantee that the necessary curriculum will be taught, and that achieving that goal is viable in the course of a school year. Hanover Community Schools realizes the importance of this responsibility, and how essential it is to an informed citizenry.

During the last school year, the District implemented the use of curriculum maps with careful attention to how and when the Indiana Academic Standards are taught during the year. Throughout the school year, teachers meet to identify what students need to learn to master in each quarter. Additionally, short assessments, what some might remember as 'quizzes,' have been created that align with the Standards in an effort to determine how kids are performing. This affords teachers an opportunity to intervene quickly should kids struggle with the given content.

The curriculum maps have been aligned with the understanding that what is taught and learned in a given year is that which is necessary to help students be successful in the following school year. The discussions and planning that occur are not contained to one grade level, but include all grade levels. This work will continue year after year, because curriculum maps are fluid documents that need our constant review and revision. The maps are the blueprint for instruction that take your children, our students from the age of five and forward, from cradle to college or career.

The role of Curriculum Director is very rewarding, and it allows me the opportunity to guide the discussions and work that are essential to the academic progression of our kids, to view their progress with a lens that is panoramic as they move from elementary school to middle school and, finally, high school. I have the responsibility, everyday, to work with teachers and formulate a curriculum that will offer your child the best possible opportunities for success in a world that is constantly changing, that will offer new careers and paths that we can't even imagine today, and help ensure that your expectations for your child's future move toward reality. That's an incredible responsibility and an even greater joy.

Online Registration



This is the second year Hanover Schools will be using online enrollment. This process replaces the use of paper forms. If you don't have access to a computer, help is available. Hanover Central Middle School will again host an open use night of school computers for anyone wishing to register on August 4th from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. and from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.

Should I create an account?

If you have never completed an online enrollment using InfoSnap, our online enrollment tool, you should create an account. Doing so allows you to securely save your work and return to the enrollment form at a later time. Using your email address or cell phone number as your user ID is an easy way to ensure you have ready access to your account.

Steps to Success with InfoSnap

If you already have an account, you can sign in and complete the form. You should use the same account to complete forms for multiple children.

Do I have to answer all the questions?

Questions marked with a red asterisk (*) are required.

What if I make a mistake?

If you would like to make a change, click on the underlined field or click "< Prev" to return to a previous page.

I've completed the form, now what?

When you have finished entering your information, click "Submit." This will send all of the information you have entered to your child's school. If the 'submit' feature does not respond, please re-visit fields highlighted with text indicating, "**Required.**"

What If I have more than one student in the district?

Do I need to complete a separate enrollment for each child? Yes, because you'll need to provide information that is specific to each child. We recommend that you submit one enrollment and then start another. This will allow you to copy shared family information, saving time and ensuring accurate information is transmitted.

Returning Students

Returning students can be registered by logging into the Power School Parent account (<http://hcps.hanover.k12.in.us/public>) and using the InfoSnap Returning Student Enrollment link found in the Navigation menu. Some returning student data will already appear on the form. Please review this data for accuracy and make any necessary changes.

Meal Account Information

Students have the opportunity to be provided an online, prepaid account found at www.mymealtime.com. To sign up for an account, use your student(s) ID number. Online deposits take 15 minutes to process and may be made with a credit/debit card. Deposits can be made at each school using cash (no change given) or a check made out to your school's cafe. Elementary students will need to send deposits at the beginning of the school day in an envelope marked with their full name, as well as their teacher's name. Middle and High School students can make deposits at breakfast or lunch. Mealtime can also send you a reminder email when funds are low in the account.

Hanover uses the Touch & Go Biometrics System for point of sale customer identification. This system eliminates the need to remember PIN numbers or carry ID cards. An individual's unique print is generated into a mathematical template that creates only identifying points-not the whole print. This unique template system cannot be accessed for replication by other security systems.

Need Assistance With Nutrition Costs?

Benefits for families that were approved for the Meal Assistance program in 2015-2016 will expire September 28, 2016. **You must fill out a new application to apply for assistance for the 2016-2017 school year.** Applications may take up to 10 days to be processed and meal charges that occur before the application is processed and approved will apply. Assistance applications are available on the website and at all school offices and will be accepted anytime during the school year. Only one application is needed per family.
