From The Superintendent

I have had the privilege of conducting community forums over the last nine months. What has become known as "A Night Out With the Superintendent" has gradually picked up steam as attendance continues to increase at these events. I want those that have attended to know how appreciative I am of their time and their input. The dialogue has been good. I am also appreciative of those who have emailed me, stating that, due to family or work commitments they could not make the meeting but would like to offer their point of view as well. These forums have given me the opportunity to throw out ideas and possible concerns that I have about delivering quality educational services to Hanover kids. It also has given you the opportunity to respond and me to listen. I have heard concerns and viewpoints that I hadn't thought about. Certainly, the learning has occurred in both directions. It has underscored the adage that "All the IQs in the room are greater than one IQ."



Up to this point, I have used the forums to have conversations around four topics. These topics include:

1. Moving the 5th grade to the middle school due to space concerns at the two elementary schools.
2. The idea of a balanced calendar to provide an end to the semester before Christmas and balancing breaks in the schedule.
3. A look at later start times for middle school and high school students based on widely accepted findings in adolescent sleep research.
4. Moving teaching and learning models to a more personalized learning environment for students with the introduction of a plan to give every student a digital device, commonly referred to as a 1:1 environment.

Over the course of the last seven forums, I have received productive feedback from the Hanover Community. One valuable idea was to provide several links to some of the sleep research on our school website. That has been done. Another suggestion was to survey the school community concerning balanced calendar options. That has been done. I have listened and am pleased to have provided pathways for communication and involvement.

In the end, the School Board and I are charged with making decisions. While our decisions will not make everybody happy, I do feel strongly that by keeping our communication pathway open, we are making better informed decisions for our students and school community. Once again, I would like to thank the Hanover Community for their involvement and input.

I would like to invite you to our last forum of this school year. It will be held at the high school, in the cafeteria on March 23, at 6:30 P.M. I hope to see you there.
