What's in Place

- Emergency Response Plan
 - All Hazard Protocols for internal and external threats
 - Includes Run/Hide/Defend protocol
- CrisisGo App
 - Installed on Staff and Law Enforcement Smart Devices
 - Includes Alerts, Rosters, Notice Groups and Checklists
- Access Control
 - Safe Visitor Solutions
 - Background checks for all visitors entering school buildings

What's in Place (Continued)

- Video Surveillance
 - HD Cameras with DVR's at all indoor and outdoor facilities
- Weather Alert System
 - Earth Networks Siren and Strobe on all campuses
 - Severe storm and “wet bulb” notification for coaches
- Anonymous Tip Reports
 - App installed on all student chrome books
 - Promotes “See Something Say Something” Campaign



Teamwork

- Positive relationships with local authorities.
 - Police Officers serving as School Resource Officers
 - Collaboration on issues that impact safety and security
- Building and District-level training
 - Focus on DHS and FEMA Disaster Framework (NIMS)
 - Mitigation, Preparedness, Response and Recovery
- Ongoing Review and Evaluation
 - Staff Certifications as Indiana School Safety Specialists
 - Table top exercises to promote staff preparedness



Other Measures

- School-wide Safety Drills.
 - Local First Responders involved in evaluation
- Micro-Drills
 - Classroom review and practice of safety protocols
- “See Something, Say Something”
 - Promotes a positive School climate
 - Encourages students to report information they see or hear that may affect school safety.
 - Includes Bullying, Peer Conflict, Safety, Self-harm, Drugs, etc.



Community Response

- Parents

- Talk to your students. Adolescence is a time when young people struggle with their changing sense of identity. Celebrate their achievements, forgive their mistakes and listen to them when they have a problem. Children whose parents are actively involved in their lives are less likely to engage in harmful or inappropriate behavior.

- The “New Normal”

- Our society is exposed to more “real” violence than at any time in history. Awareness, planning and preparation are essential components of a community-wide approach to safety and security.
